10 11 12	WHEREAS, the United States Constitution is the oldest written national constitution in the world and serves as the fundamental document that establishes the role of government and defines the basic rights of all people; and
13	
14 15	WHEREAS, the Constitution's first three words, "We the People" affirm that the United States government exists to serve the people of this nation and not the other way around; and
16	
17 18	WHEREAS, the Bill of Rights added the first ten amendments to the United States Constitution in order to provide specific guarantees of personal freedoms, clearly defined
19 20	limitations on the government's power, and explicit declarations that all rights and powers not granted to the U.S. Congress are reserved for the states or the people; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin which was ratified in 1848 and is
23	one of the oldest U.S. state constitutions still in use ratified the Bill of Rights and contains a
24	Declaration of Rights which states in Article I:
25	"All people are born equally free and independent, and have certain
26	inherent rights; among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of
27 28	happiness; to secure these rights, governments are instituted,
29	deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed."

31	WHEREAS, each member of the Washington County Board of Supervisors took an Oath
32	of Office swearing to support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State
33	of Wisconsin;

35	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Washington County Board of
36	Supervisors reaffirms the oath that each of its members has taken.

38	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Washington County Board of Supervisors shall
39	at all times uphold its duty to honor and respect the rights of the citizenry and shall zealously protect the fundamental liberties and freedoms We the People hold dear and sacred and challenge
